Ten People You Meet in Heaven NOAH

Genesis 6-10

- See Genesis 6:5-7, 11-13. Why would God regret making us and be broken hearted about our wickedness, corruption, and violence? Didn't He know we would be this way?
- How does God likely feel about all those same things in this world that is now overflowing with humans?
- God planted a seed of hope in Genesis 4:25-26. Noah is part of that living hope (Gen 5:28-29; 6:8). Who in Genesis 5 is said to have "walked with God" like Noah in 6:9?
- What does it mean that God is willing to invest and even start over with one person like Noah? What does that say about your own willingness to follow Jesus even when it is unpopular and no one else does?
- When God calls Noah out of the ark in Genesis 8:15-17, He uses the same language as with the first creation. How well does this do-over go? See Gen 9:20-25.
- It seems theologically absurd, but in the story what does God seem to "learn" about us. What does He decide about our fate and future? See Genesis 8:20–9:17.
- In Matthew 24:36-41 Jesus uses Noah as an example of those who don't pay attention to what is going on around them. What is the problem with just living our lives the way we want?
