Ten People you Meet in Heaven

JOHN

- John's Gospel was written last of the four. Along with his letters and the Revelation, how does he encourage you as the last voice of the New Testament?
- John believed before he saw the Risen Lord. John 20:8. He called himself "the disciple whom Jesus loved." The church fathers say that in his old age he was called 'camel knees' for his callouses from praying on his knees. What might those things say about this John?
- John explores the notion of what it means to believe in his gospel. Why is it much more than just intellectual assent? See John 3:16 and 2:23-25; how do they work together?
- Read 1 John 3:1-3; 4:16b – 21. How can your walk with Jesus be deeper as you apply these passages?
- What can we learn from John at the end of his life in 2 John by using the terms the elder, the lady, and her children in vv. 1-2, 4-5, 12-13. How relationally does he see the church? How could we emphasize that more?
- Discuss why John and Jesus don't have a "hey buddy" reunion in Revelation 1:12-19. How would you describe their reunion? What does that help us understand about our reunion with the Lord?
